From the Pastor's Desk



Next Saturday at 9 a.m. at the Cathedral the central city parishes of St. Raphael, St. Patrick and Holy Redeemer will come together for the annual Lenten Communal Penance Service with individual confession. It is a wonderful way to prepare for the moving liturgies of Holy Week.

Below are some questions, adapted from those suggested by the diocesan Office of Worship, we might consider as we examine our conscience in preparation for confession that day or another time:

Do I love people freely? Do I work to overcome my prejudices, and encourage others to do so? Do I respect the reputations and property of others? Do I treat others fairly, the way that I would like to be treated?

Am I honest and just in business dealings? Do I keep my word? Does my language offend others? Do I use the Lord's name in vain? Do I lie to others?

Do I actively promote the rights of others, especially the poor, the unborn, the frail and the lonely? Do I use my time, talent and treasure for the good of others, especially those in need?

Do I truly forgive others, and work to reconcile relationships that have been wounded? Am I willing to pray for those I have trouble liking, especially those who seem to make my life more difficult?

Do I use my free time constructively, including strengthening my relationship with God and others? Do I use it to build up God's kingdom on earth? Do I regularly practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy?

Do I regularly and willingly participate in Sunday Mass? Do I keep Sunday as a day to rejuvenate my faith life and my family life?

We pray: Merciful Father, fill our hearts with your love and keep us faithful to the gospel of Christ. In this season of Lent, give us the grace to rise above our human weakness. Grant this through Christ our Lord.

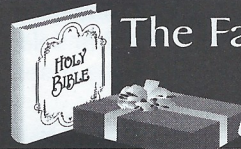

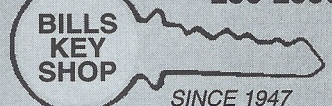

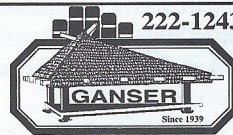
